## **Application Information**

<u>The Board Observer Program (BOP)</u> is a partnership between the Philadelphia Bar Foundation, the Delivery of Legal Services Committee of the Philadelphia Bar Association (DLSC), and the Young Lawyers Division of the Philadelphia Bar Association (YLD). The BOP gives young lawyers practicing in Philadelphia County the opportunity to learn more about local legal services organizations and other non-profits, and to gain the kinds of leadership skills necessary to serve on the boards of such organizations as well as to succeed in their future careers.

An applicant for BOP must be:

- A member of the Young Lawyers Division of the Philadelphia Bar Association; and
- Licensed to practice law in Pennsylvania and be in good standing.

If you are not yet a member of the Philadelphia Bar Association, you must join by the time your application is submitted. If you are a member of the Philadelphia Bar Association who has not reached his or her 37<sup>th</sup> birthday or are within the first three years of admission, you are automatically a member of the YLD. Applicants with a demonstrated interest in community service and/or pro bono work are preferred, but prior experience in these areas is not required for participation. Applicants who are not selected for the program are encouraged to reapply next year.

To apply, please complete the application form and provide a current résumé. Your résumé should highlight any community service and/or pro bono experience and whether you have previously served or currently serve on any boards.
