Responsibilities:

- Assisting with implementation of the Bar Foundation's current marketing and development projects, campaigns, and initiatives
- Working on varied tasks related to all aspects of marketing, communications, public relations, branding, messaging, outreach, event management, and fundraising
- Creating content for web, social media, event promotion, public relations, fundraising campaigns, and newsletters
- Providing support with event planning and other fundraising activities for the Bar Foundation
- Increasing awareness of the Bar Foundation and our non-profit partners to secure resources that support the organization's programs and services
- Conducting research for Bar Foundation projects, including but not limited to topics such as centralized intake systems, legal incubators, and social impact measurement

This position is currently remote, but there may be a chance for a hybrid model if circumstances allow.
